National Registry for Tourist and Seasonal Rentals - Spain 2025

Timeline

- January 2, 2025: Registry became operational (voluntary).
- July 1, 2025: Mandatory for all short-term rentals advertised online.

What is it?

A centralized national database assigning a unique ID number to properties used for:

- Tourist rentals (holiday lets, Airbnb, etc.)
- Seasonal rentals (temporary work, students, medical stays)

Goals:

- Increase legal transparency
- Fight illegal/unregulated rentals
- Control urban planning, prices, and taxes
- Standardize regulation across Spain

Where does it apply?

- All online platforms (Airbnb, Booking, etc.) must show the official registry number.
- Platforms must remove non-compliant listings.

Who must register?

- Anyone offering short-term or seasonal rentals.
- Room rentals are included.
- Exempt: long-term rentals (main residence), hotels, hostels, and offline-only listings.

A Penalties

- Fines, removal of ads, and inspections for properties not registered.
- Some regions (e.g., Andalusia) are legally challenging the rule.

What you must do

- 1. Register each property via the national digital platform.
- 2. Get the official ID number and update all listings.
- 3. Make sure contracts reflect proper rental use (seasonal vs. tourist).
- 4. Update ads before July 1, 2025 to avoid removal.
